

WEEK 10

RECAP



The Threshers secured a hard-fought 3-2 victory over the Knights, powered by strong offensive play and a clutch game-winning goal.

1st Period

The game began with the Threshers taking an early lead. At 4:38, Anthony LeClair scored, assisted by Brian Morgan and Eric Johnson, putting the Threshers up 1-0. The Knights managed just one shot on goal in the period, unable to find an answer to the Threshers' early momentum.

2nd Period

The Threshers doubled their lead at 1:10 in the second period when Eric Johnson found the net, assisted by Mike Alexanian and John Sances, making it 2-0. The Knights pushed back, generating more offensive chances but still couldn't get past Thresher's goalie Joe Burke, who held strong to preserve the shutout.

3rd Period

The third period was action-packed. The Knights mounted a comeback, starting with a goal from Ryan Reale at 9:10, assisted by Tom Smith and Jack Bannon, cutting the Threshers' lead to 2-1. However, the Threshers responded with the game-winning goal at 10:34 when John Sances scored, assisted by Eric Johnson and Mike Alexanian, restoring the two-goal advantage.
