The Mariners are proving they're a force to be reckoned with this season, putting on a spectacular offensive display in their 9-4 victory over the Threshers. As last season's runners-up, they've come out swinging and wasted no time setting the tone. It all started in the first period with a flurry of goals—John Krukiel, Rob Schroeter, and Nick Mayo all found the back of the net, showcasing the Mariners' explosive offensive depth. With each goal, the Threshers seemed to get pushed further and further back, unable to match the Mariners' relentless pace.

The second period saw the Mariners tighten their grip, with another four goals lighting up the scoreboard. Schroeter scored his second of the game, followed by a timely game-winner from Alex Lee, as the Mariners' playmakers continued to shine. Peter Krukiel was a constant threat, adding an assist to his name and setting up some crucial plays, while Mayo found the back of the net again, making sure the Threshers couldn't find any momentum. Despite a few bright spots from the Threshers, including a goal by Kevin Cinquegrano, the Mariners' offensive juggernaut simply couldn't be stopped.



As the third period unfolded, the Mariners didn't take their foot off the gas. Mayo's second goal of the game, combined with more points from Krukiel and Dave Kendrick, turned the match into a true display of dominance. The second period belonged to the Bulls' relentless attack. Tony Rota extended the lead with a slick goal assisted by Killion and Mike Debenedictis, demonstrating the Bulls' ability to spread the puck around and create scoring chances. But the highlight of the night came in the third period on a powerplay—a dazzling tic-tac-toe goal that had fans on their feet. Andy Cancellieri capped off a sequence of precision passing from Carabin, Fuller, Sigsworth and Killion, threading the puck into the back of the net with clinical ease. It was the kind of powerplay perfection that gives opposing penalty kills nightmares.

While the Monarchs managed to break through with a late goal from Alex Bernstein, their offense was largely stymied by Bulls netminder, who stopped 13 of 14 shots. The game was a battle, marked by crunching hits and gritty play along the boards, but the Bulls' ability to capitalize on their chances and execute in key moments sealed the deal. With performances like this, the Bulls are proving they have the firepower and resilience to make a serious playoff push.

Chris Boussy and Taylor answered back, restoring their dominance and showcasing the Jackets' ability to transition from defense to attack in the blink of an eye. Petricig, who finished with an astounding four points, seemed to be everywhere, orchestrating plays and setting up teammates with precision. The Jackets' constant movement and quick passes left the Knights scrambling, struggling to keep pace with their high-energy offense.

By the third period, the Yellowjackets had put the game well out of reach, with Eric Murray striking again to cap off his stellar night. Even a last-second Knights goal couldn't dim the spotlight on the Jackets' explosive performance. Goalie Adam Figlioli stood tall when tested, but truthfully, the Knights had little opportunity to

get into the game thanks to the Jackets' ceaseless attack. With this kind of intensity and offensive depth, the Yellowjackets look like a team that could sting any opponent into submission.
