Badge Update

This week saw standout performances across the league, with players earning badges for their impressive efforts on the ice. Two players claimed the **Sharpshooter** badge for netting three goals in a game, while two goaltenders earned the **Brick Wall** badge for delivering shutout performances.

John Petricig of the Yellowjackets continued his scoring dominance, earning the Sharpshooter badge with a three-goal performance that led his team to a commanding 5-0 victory over the Knights. John Dunn of the **Reapers** also secured a Sharpshooter badge with a hat trick, including the overtime game-winner in a thrilling 5-4 victory against the Hawks.

On the defensive side, **Bryan Prendeville** subbing for the **Yellowjackets** and **Matt Nelson** of the **Spartans** each earned the **Brick Wall** badge by shutting out their opponents. Prendeville anchored the Yellowjackets' dominant defensive effort, while Nelson's flawless performance backstopped the Spartans to a decisive 4-0 win over the Longhorns.

Mariners Hold Off Threshers in Tight Defensive Battle

The Mariners edged past the Threshers in a tightly contested 3-2 victory, relying on strong defensive play and timely scoring. The first period saw both teams exchange goals, with John Krukiel opening the scoring for the Mariners at 9:52, assisted by Rob McDonnell. The Threshers responded late in the period when Kevin Duggan found the back of the net with help from Travis Dupuis, leveling the score at 1-1.

In the second period, the Threshers briefly took the lead thanks to an unassisted goal from Eric Johnson at 5:09. However, the Mariners quickly answered back. Ryan Conachen tied the game with a goal set up by McDonnell and Peter Krukiel. Just minutes later, Dave Kendrick netted the game-winner at 2:33, with Krukiel earning his second assist of the night. Both goaltenders - Joe Burke for the Threshers and Mike Ciavattieri for the Mariners - stood tall in the final frame, preventing any further scoring.

The third period remained scoreless as the Mariners' defense successfully protected their slim lead. The Threshers struggled to generate offense, managing only three shots on goal. Despite Johnson's continued offensive contributions—building on his earlier performance against the Yellowjackets—his effort wasn't enough to push the Threshers past a disciplined Mariners squad. This win marks another solid performance for the Mariners, with Rob McDonnell and Peter Krukiel playing pivotal roles in their offensive output.




Yellowjackets Dominate Knights with Shutout Victory

The Yellowjackets delivered an impressive 5-0 shutout victory over the Knights, fueled by a standout performance from John Petricig. Petricig opened the scoring just over four minutes into the first period with what would become the game-winning goal, assisted by Chris Boussy and Eric Murray. He struck again at 1:36, this time with another assist from Murray, giving the Yellowjackets an early two-goal cushion. The Knights struggled to generate offense, managing only six shots in the opening frame against a stingy Yellowjackets defense.

Petricig continued his scoring spree in the second period, completing a hat-trick with an unassisted goal at 10:36. Meanwhile, the Knights couldn't find a way past Yellowjackets goaltender Bryan Prendeville, who

anchored the team's defense through the first two periods. Despite a pair of penalties against Chris Yuknis, the Yellowjackets' penalty kill unit remained flawless, shutting down the Knights' limited opportunities. This marks another dominant performance for Petricig, who now has 13 goals this season, solidifying his position as a key offensive force.

The Yellowjackets sealed the win with two more goals in the third period. Jason Bernard extended the lead with an unassisted goal at 3:54 before setting up Sean Taylor at 2:32 to cap the scoring. The Knights' goaltender, Adam Figlioli, who previously posted a shutout against the Monarchs, faced a relentless 33-shot barrage. With this commanding win, the Yellowjackets continue to showcase their offensive firepower and defensive discipline, while the Knights search for answers after being held scoreless.




Monarchs Prevail in Overtime Thriller Against Bulls

The Monarchs secured a dramatic 2-1 overtime victory against the Bulls, with Matt McCourt delivering the game-winning goal. The Bulls struck first in the opening period when Tom Powers found the back of the net at 6:38, assisted by Marty Carabin and John Killion. Despite being outshot 25-11, the Monarchs remained resilient, relying on solid goaltending from Marc Utera to keep the deficit manageable. Both teams played a disciplined first period, with only minor penalties slowing the action.

The Monarchs evened the score in the second period with a shorthanded goal by Rian Kearney at 6:37. Kearney, assisted by McCourt and Matt Gibson, delivered a crucial momentum shift for the Monarchs. The Bulls continued to press, firing 10 shots on goal in the third period, but Utera stood tall. Fury Top Bolts in Overtime Battle

The Fury claimed a hard-fought 2-1 overtime victory against the Bolts, with Chuck Peterson delivering both goals, including the game-winner. Peterson opened the scoring at 6:59 in the first period with an unassisted tally, giving the Fury an early lead. Despite being outshot 25-18 overall, the Bolts stayed within striking distance thanks to the steady goaltending of Rick Welch, who held the Fury scoreless through the second period. Both teams played a disciplined game, with no penalties recorded across all four periods.

The Bolts found life late in the third period when Jeff Uva netted the equalizer at 3:30, assisted by Dave Richardson. This marked Uva's first goal of the season, while Richardson added to his team-leading assist total with his fifth of the year. The Bolts' offensive pressure increased in the final frame, outshooting the Fury 8-7, but Fury goaltender Dan Nason stood firm.
