Yellowjackets Withstand Bulls' Barrage to Win Masters Fall 2025 Championship

The Masters Division Fall 2026 Final was a grind from start to finish, with the Bulls dictating much of the pace and firing shot after shot at the Yellowjackets' net. Despite being under pressure for most of the opening period, the Yellowjackets delivered a massive momentum swing late, scoring with just 18 seconds left in the first period. Bill McIver capitalized to send the Yellowjackets into the break - up 1-0, a gut punch to a Bulls team that had controlled play early.

The second period followed a similar script, with the Bulls continuing to generate chances but struggling to solve goaltender John Belanger. The decisive moment came short-handed, when Chris Boussy jumped into the play and finished a clutch breakaway to double the Yellowjackets' lead. That short-handed marker proved to be the game-winner, as the Bulls' frustration grew despite owning a sizable edge in shots.

The Bulls finally broke through with a short-handed goal of their own late in the third to pull within one, but any comeback hopes were quickly extinguished. Ryan Twigg answered just seconds later, restoring the two-goal cushion and sealing the championship. Outshot 32-15, the Yellowjackets leaned on opportunistic scoring, disciplined special teams, and a championship-caliber performance from Belanger to claim the Masters Division Fall 2025 title.

Knights Claim "Last Call Cup" Bragging Rights in Best-of-the-Worst Showdown

The Masters Division “Last Call Cup” delivered exactly what it promised — pride, chaos, and one final chance to avoid the cellar. The Knights jumped out early and never fully let go, scoring twice in the opening period to seize control despite being outshot by the Mariners. Goals from Adam Figlioli and John Hagan gave the Knights a 2–1 edge after one, answering an early Mariners push and setting the tone for a wide-open night.

The second period proved decisive. The Knights poured in three goals, highlighted by Colin Garrity’s eventual game-winner, while Brian Pineau and Justin Figlioli kept the pressure on with strong net-front finishes. The Mariners showed fight with a goal from Shayne Fryia, but defensive breakdowns and missed assignments proved costly as the Knights stretched the lead to 5–2 heading into the third.

The Mariners made one last push early in the final frame, with Fryia striking again to cut the deficit, but the Knights slammed the door with a short-handed goal from Justin Figlioli to seal the 6–3 win. Goaltender Adam Figlioli backstopped the effort with timely saves as the Knights weathered a 22-shot Mariners attack. When the dust settled, the Knights skated away with the Last Call Cup — officially crowned the best of the worst, and proudly owning it.

Longhorns Shut Out Fury to Capture Classics Championship

The Longhorns delivered a complete performance when it mattered most, blanking the Fury 4–0 to claim the Classics Division championship. Tim Routhier opened the scoring midway through the first period with what would stand as the game-winning goal, setting the tone early. Just minutes later, Mike Crisp struck short-handed, capitalizing on a Fury miscue and giving the Longhorns a commanding 2–0 edge after one despite a tightly contested opening frame.

The second period saw the Longhorns continue to dictate play with disciplined defense and opportunistic offense. John Sances extended the lead with a well-worked goal off assists from Bob Sideropoulos and Ed Mortell, while the Longhorns netminder turned aside every Fury chance, frustrating a team that had shown offensive firepower throughout the playoffs. The Fury generated pressure, but couldn’t solve or break through the Longhorns’ structured defensive zone coverage.

Any hopes of a Fury comeback were erased just 13 seconds into the third period when Mortell buried his second point of the night, effectively sealing the championship. From there, the Longhorns locked things down, killing penalties and closing out a composed, championship-caliber effort. With the shutout victory, the Longhorns capped their playoff run in dominant fashion, lifting the Classics title behind timely scoring, special-teams execution, and a flawless performance in goal.

Captain John “JC” Currie Leads Patriots to First Federals Division Title

The Patriots made history with a dominant 5–1 victory over the Bulldogs, capturing the team’s first-ever Federals Division championship under the leadership of captain John “JC” Currie. The game was effectively decided in a blistering first period, as the Patriots erupted for four unanswered goals in less than six minutes. Kevin Bossi opened the scoring, followed quickly by the eventual game-winner from John Scagliarini.
