#### Knights Grind Out 3–1 Win Over Vipers

#### Threshers Roll Past Monarchs 6–1

The Monarchs struck first when Kirk Douglas buried an unassisted marker just past the seven-minute mark, but that would be their last highlight of the night. The Threshers answered quickly, with Michael Thamert tying the game less than a minute later to send things to the intermission knotted at one.

The second period belonged entirely to the Threshers. The Bulls generated chances with seven first-period shots but couldn't solve John Belanger.

The Bulls answered with a hardworking goal from Rich Fuller—set up by Josh Tobias and Alex Mesheau—but Yellowjackets pressure kept them from gaining any sustained momentum.

In the third, the Yellowjackets slammed the door shut. John Petricig took over the frame with back-to-back goals in under a minute, stretching the lead to 5–1 and putting the game out of reach. With both teams already locked into playoff spots, the Jackets looked every bit postseason-ready, while the Bulls will regroup and prepare for the games that matter most.

### Kodiaks Storm Back, Win 4–3 in Overtime Thriller Against Mariners

The Kodiaks erased a late two-goal deficit and capped the comeback with an overtime winner, taking down the Mariners 4–3 in one of the wildest finishes of the season.

The Mariners struck first on the power play when Peter Krukiel buried his third of the year from John Krukiel and Shayne Fryja. But the Kodiaks answered quickly—Andrew MacNeil tied it less than two minutes later off a setup from Robert Mooney.

After a scoreless second, the game opened up in the third. Krukiel added his second of the night to put the Mariners back on top, and Alex Lee extended the lead to 3–1 on another power-play marker.

In OT, the Kodiaks needed only one chance. At 3:54, Bernard struck again—this time the game-winner—off a feed from Neal Vitello and Jack Allen.

The Mariners controlled the special teams battle, but the Kodiaks' resilience stole the show. A statement win heading into the playoff push.
