Yellowjackets Outlast Knights in Overtime Thriller

The Yellowjackets and Knights skated to a tightly contested matchup that lived up to its billing, ending in a dramatic 3–2 Yellowjackets overtime victory. The Knights opened the scoring midway through the first period when Sean Foley finished a feed from Matt Gibson at 8:18, but the Yellowjackets responded quickly. Dan Chouinard answered at 2:41, burying a chance set up by Kevin Marani and Drew Fitzgerald to send the teams into the first intermission knotted at 1–1.

After a scoreless second period marked by disciplined defensive play and timely saves at both ends, the game opened up in the third. Justin Figlioli put the Knights back in front at 9:42, converting off passes from Foley and Matt Fredrickson. Once again, the Yellowjackets showed resilience, as Eric Murray evened the score at 2:54 with help from Trey McMillen and Chris Boussy, forcing overtime after regulation ended tied 2–2.

In the extra frame, Sean Taylor played hero for the Yellowjackets, scoring the unassisted game-winner at 2:38 of overtime. John Belanger earned the win in goal, helping the Yellowjackets edge the Knights despite being outshot slightly, 27–24. Adam Figlioli took the loss for the Knights after a strong effort between the pipes in a fast-paced contest that showcased playoff-level intensity early in the SSCHL 2026 Winter League season.

Mariners' Offensive Surge Overwhelms Monarchs

The Mariners jumped out early and never looked back, rolling to a 9–4 victory over the Monarchs in a high-scoring SSCHL Winter League matchup. Shayne Fryia set the tone in the opening period, scoring twice at 4:30 and 2:15 to give the Mariners a 2–0 lead after one. Despite the Monarchs generating nine shots in the first, Mariners goaltender Mike Ciavattieri stood tall to keep the visitors off the board.

The game broke open in the second period as the Mariners poured in four goals, including the eventual game-winner from Rob McDonnell at the 7:00 mark. Fryia completed his hat trick at 11:42, while John Krukiel and James Doucette also found the back of the net during a dominant stretch that saw the Mariners control play and match the Monarchs shot-for-shot in the middle frame. Kirk Douglas provided a spark for the Monarchs late in the period with two goals, both set up by Dan McKinney, but the Mariners still carried a commanding 6–2 advantage into the third.

The teams traded goals in a wide-open third period, with Douglas completing his own hat trick for the Monarchs and McKinney adding another marker. However, the Mariners answered each push, getting goals from Dave Kendrick, John Krukiel, and Jonathan Levasseur—including one with just 13 seconds remaining—to seal the 9–4 win. Ciavattieri earned the victory after turning aside 21 shots, while the Mariners’ 37-shot offensive effort proved too much for the Monarchs to overcome.

Vipers Pull Away to Defeat Bulls 6–2

The Vipers used balanced scoring and steady pressure to earn a 6–2 win over the Bulls in SSCHL action. The teams traded goals early, with Mike Wright opening the scoring for the Vipers before Matt Norton answered for the Bulls. Albert Clark restored the Vipers’ lead later in the first period, sending them into the break up 2–1 while holding a slight edge in shots.

Momentum shifted firmly in the Vipers’ favor during the second period as Wright netted the eventual game-winning goal at 10:16, finishing a play set up by Mike McCarthy and Clark. The Bulls struggled to generate sustained offense in the middle frame, managing just five shots as the Vipers controlled possession and dictated the pace.

The Vipers put the game away in the third period, striking three times to break things open. McCarthy scored twice, including a power-play marker, while Clark continued his strong night by adding another goal and assist. Kodiaks Dominate Threshers with 6–2 Victory
