Yellowjackets Roll Past Vipers in 9–2 Offensive Showcase

The Yellowjackets controlled the game from the opening puck drop, powering past the Vipers 9–2 behind sustained pressure and balanced scoring. Early goals from John Petricig and Shay Kilfoye set the tone in the first period as the Yellowjackets dominated possession and carried a wide shot advantage throughout the night.

The second period broke the game open, with the Yellowjackets scoring four more times and turning a close contest into a rout. Trey McMillen was at the center of the surge, piling up multiple points and helping generate nearly every key scoring play, while Ryan Twigg and Chris Yuknis added to the offensive wave. The Vipers briefly answered with goals from Albert Clark and Brendan Bohld, but they were unable to slow the momentum.

The Yellowjackets sealed the result with three more goals in the third, including Petricig's second of the night and a late finish from Rob Malone.
