#### Yellowjackets Explode for 12 in High-Scoring Win Over Threshers

The Yellowjackets turned the game into an offensive showcase, rolling past the Threshers 12–7 in a fast-paced Masters Division matchup that saw goals come in waves. After falling behind early, the Yellowjackets erupted for five first-period goals to seize control and never looked back, finishing the night with a 31–23 edge in shots.

John Petricig was the driving force, scoring six times in a dominant performance that repeatedly broke open the Threshers' defense. Trey McMillen added a hat trick and was a constant presence all over the ice, while Dan Chouinard and Shay Kilfoye also chipped in with key goals to keep the pressure on across all three periods.

The Threshers battled throughout and generated offense of their own, led by multi-goal efforts from Eric Johnson, Michael Thamert, and Kane Haffey. However, the turning point came late in the second period when the Yellowjackets grabbed the game-winning goal and followed it with a strong third period to pull away and secure the convincing victory.

#### Mariners Hold Off Late Push to Edge Bulls 5–4

The Mariners jumped out early and managed to hang on for a 5–4 win over the Bulls in a tightly contested Masters Division matchup. Trevor Malmgren opened the scoring and later added his second of the night, while Rob McDonnell also found the net in the first period as the Mariners built a 2–1 lead despite steady pressure from the Bulls.

The second period proved pivotal, as the Mariners capitalized on special teams and quick strikes to stretch the margin. Dave Kendrick scored on the power play, and Malmgren struck again just seconds before the horn to give the Mariners

a two-goal cushion. The Bulls stayed within reach thanks to Rich Fuller's marker, but Mike Ciavattieri stood tall in goal during key stretches as the Mariners weathered extended offensive-zone time.

The Bulls mounted a strong third-period push, outshooting the Mariners and getting goals from Alex Mesheu and Jason O'Connell to keep things close. ### Monarchs Rally Late, Top Knights 3–2 in Overtime

The Monarchs erased a late deficit and completed a dramatic comeback, edging the Knights 3–2 in overtime in a Masters Division matchup. After a scoreless first period, the Knights struck first on a second-period power play and carried a 1–0 lead into the third, despite being outshot throughout the night.

Chad Gillpatrick scored both Knights goals, including an early third-period marker that made it 2–0 and put the visitors in control. The Monarchs responded with urgency, finally breaking through midway into the third as Rian Kearney got them on the board before Ryan Boudreau tied the game late, swinging momentum firmly to the home side.

Overtime belonged to the Monarchs, as Ryan Murphy buried the game-winner just over three minutes in to cap the rally. Jeff Delnickas stopped 11 of 13 shots for the win, while the Monarchs' steady pressure — reflected in a 24–13 shots advantage — ultimately wore down the Knights and secured the extra point.

### Kodiaks Erupt in Second Period, Blank Vipers 5–0

After a quiet opening period, the Kodiaks took full control with a four-goal outburst in the second to roll past the Vipers 5–0 in a Masters Division showdown. Jason Bernard opened the scoring with an unassisted goal that proved to be the game-winner, sparking a stretch where the Kodiaks scored four times in just over six minutes.

### **Patriots Overpower Chiefs 6–2 in Federals Division Clash**
