Knights Storm Back with Six-Goal Third to Down Bulls 9–4

The Bulls came out flying with three first-period goals, as Jason O’Connell opened the scoring and later added another in the second to give his team a 4–3 lead midway through the game. Early tallies from Bill Hingston and Rob Schwartz helped the Bulls seize momentum, but the Knights began chipping away in the second period with goals from Chad Gillpatrick, John Hagan, and Colin Garrity to keep the contest tight.

Everything changed in the third period, when the Knights erupted for six unanswered goals in a stunning offensive outburst. Adam Fenton netted the go-ahead goal early in the frame, and the floodgates opened from there. Sean Foley scored twice in quick succession, Garrity added another, and Adam Solari capped the surge with two late goals to put the game out of reach.

Nick Anderson earned the win in net as the Knights completed one of the most dramatic turnarounds of the season. After trailing by three early, the Knights’ relentless third-period attack powered them to a decisive 9–4 victory.
