Vipers Edge Knights in Shootout After 2–2 Battle

The Vipers earned a hard-fought shootout victory over the Knights after the teams battled to a 2–2 tie through regulation and overtime. The Knights jumped out quickly, taking the lead just 21 seconds into the game when Adam Solari finished a setup from Sam Perkins to make it 1–0.

The Vipers answered later in the first period when Ross Reale tied the game at 10:40, finishing a play created by Albert Clark to send the teams into the intermission even at 1–1.

The Knights regained the lead in the second period when Nick Anderson converted a pass from Jack Bannon and Adam Fenton at 5:25 to make it 2–1. The Vipers responded just over two minutes later as Johnny Camara buried a chance from Albert Clark and Tom Doucette to tie the game 2–2.

Both teams tightened defensively from there, with Bobby Siders stopping 19 shots for the Knights while Brian Prendeville turned aside 17 for the Vipers to force overtime. After a scoreless extra session, the game moved to a shootout where the Vipers prevailed, with Brendan Bohld scoring the deciding goal while Prendeville stopped all three Knights attempts.

Kodiaks Storm Back to Defeat Bulls 4–3 in Overtime

The Kodiaks mounted an impressive third-period comeback before completing the rally with an overtime winner to defeat the Bulls 4–3. Patriots Defeat Presidents 5–2 Behind Balanced Attack

The Patriots came out firing and never looked back, defeating the Presidents 5–2 in a strong team performance. The Patriots scored early in the first period with two goals within a minute, giving them immediate momentum.
