Kodiaks Dominate from Start to Finish in 12-1 Rout of Yellowjackets

The Kodiaks delivered a statement performance, overwhelming the Yellowjackets 12-1 in a one-sided contest. The game was effectively decided in the opening period, as the Kodiaks erupted for six goals. Tyler Fiumara and Robert Mooney each scored twice in the frame, while Andrew MacNeil contributed multiple assists as the offense fired on all cylinders. Mooney's early tally stood as the game-winner, and by the end of the first, the Kodiaks had built an insurmountable 6-0 lead.

The dominance continued into the second period, with MacNeil taking over offensively by scoring twice to extend the lead.
