Monarchs Explode Late to Defeat Kodiaks 6–1

The Monarchs jumped out to an early lead and never looked back, defeating the Kodiaks 6–1. Ryan Boudreau opened the scoring in the first period with help from Ben Perrotta and Matt McCourt, and Will Hess followed with the eventual game-winning goal at 5:06, assisted by Kirk Douglas. The Kodiaks struggled to generate momentum early, falling behind 2–0 after one period.

Kodiaks got on the board in the second period with an unassisted goal from Brandon Blake, cutting the deficit to 2–1. However, that would be the closest they would get. The Monarchs tightened up defensively and limited further chances, keeping control of the game heading into the third period.
